Several library patrons have discovered that the library has just what they're looking for - a room they can "purchase" and on whose door a plaque records the honor or remembrance.

The concept grew from a request from Mrs. Amanda Knobel. She wished to give her husband, Stuart, a special birthday present. His pet projects are anything that involves literacy and books. She chose to "purchase" Conference Room 1 on the Main Library's second floor. A plaque has been placed on the door, and the funds are being used to expand the library's audiobook collection. Plates recognizing the honor are placed in each audiobook case.

Since that first gift, many have chosen to do the same. The McDougald and Fretwell families honored Margaret Parker Fretwell's 90th birthday with one of the tutoring rooms in the Children's Department at the Main Library. Noting that the rocking chair in the Children's Playroom reminded him of that of his late wife, Betty Jean, James

Cobb "purchased" that room in her memory.

An anonymous donor selected another of the Children's Dept. tutoring rooms to honor Eleanor Farmer for her devotion to children's literacy. Arthur Montgomery has remembered his late wife, Marjorie, with the "purchase" of Conference Room 2 on the second floor of the Main Library.

The Conference Room on the first floor has been named in memory of Ethel Brown, by Mildred Brown Hopkins and Dr. and Mrs. Connor Hopkins. The late Mary Vandiver Moorhead's contribution to children's and adult literacy in Anderson has been remembered by her family with a plaque on Conference Room 3 on the second floor.

Family and friends of the late Jean McKinney have honored her memory in a number of ways. Two benches have been placed in the Children's Garden at the Main Library in her memory. Additionally, a children's tutoring room has been named for her, and the donated amount will be used to expand the poetry collections in the children's sections of the Main Library and branch libraries.
